The New Dock at Rooster's Waterfront Restaurant



It's finally here...the dock a lot of us have been waiting for. Although it's not fully completed...the main part is working and floating!!! Please remember that the walkway is NOT completed yet and the walkway up to Rooster's and the walkway will not be finished for a few months...Use caution...

Tips for tying to a dock – The water is about 9.5 ft deep on the outside of the dock – that's high water...make sure you know the depth before going in...

- 1. Step 1 - Slow the boat as you approach the dock. This represents good manners (reducing the wake for other boaters) and good sense (since you don't need to ram the dock).**
- 2. Step 2 - Aim for an open place along the dock. You should have a crewman at the bow with the docking line ready. At this point, you will likely have either lowered your sails or let them luff and allowed yourself to drift in.**
- 3. Step 3 - Toss your docking cushions over the side to prevent damage to the boat or dock.**
- 4. Step 4 - As you draw closer, the crewman in the bow should jump to the dock and guide the boat in.**
- 5. Step 5 - Tie off to the hitches fore and aft.**

Don't forget to visit Sam while at Rooster's once the dock is complete!!!!

Ahoy Again- The Art of Sailing

Experience is the Best Teacher. If you are new to sailing then get connected with someone who has a sailboat and hitch a ride. (It is best if the person with the sailboat knows how to sail also!!) If you are still interested after your experience, check out a book on sailing and get the dynamics of sailing and also the nautical vocabulary used. Port, Starboard, Bow, Stern, Forward, Aft, Jib, Jib Sheet, Main, Main Sheet, Tacking, Jibing, **Duck!!!** Running, reaching, On the Wind, Luffing, Full & Away, Easing Off, **Duck!!!** Topside, Below Decks, Galley, Head, etc, act. Now that you are armed with "**the language**" you might be able to sign on as a neophyte crew and get some hands-on experience. Don't take offense when the captain shouts a command at you, this is normal, he/she just wants to be sure that you hear him/her and do what he/she says.

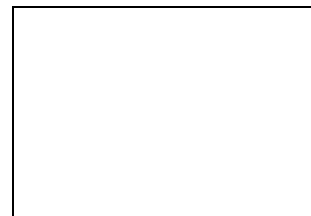
